



BEFORE YOU SIGN KNOW WHAT YOU ARE SIGNING

The governor is circulating petitions on all CSU campuses to gather signatures to place his agenda on the ballot. In doing so, he is undermining the legislative process and putting the security of the public in jeopardy.

Signature gatherers are getting paid up to \$10 for each signature they collect for three initiatives that would:

- Cap the amount the state pays into our employee pensions and force new hires into risky individual accounts.
- Cap spending on the CSU and other public services, such as public safety, transportation and education.

- Worsen job security for K-12 teachers.

The California Faculty Association asks that if you are approached — please don't sign.

These signature gatherers are using misleading phrases to get people to sign, like, “this will help education” or “this will help protect staff and faculty pensions.”

If you have already signed any of these petitions you may withdraw your name by making the request in writing to the county elections office where you are registered to vote before the petitions are submitted, which most likely will be April 15.
